The lesson materials are interdisciplinary and can be used by a classroom teacher or a music specialist.

Transportation

Limited funds are available for school buses for those in need of assistance through the KCCO. Missouri schools are eligible for a one time grant of up to \$300 from the Missouri Arts Council to attend a program, if applied for at least 30 days in advance. The Target Foundation also has grants for field trips in 2017. Please contact the education staff for more information.
